Tuition

Covenant Christian School is reliant upon tuition fees and Government recurrent funding to meet costs. In order to keep fees to a minimum, families are required to assist in various duties as part of the Parental Assistance Scheme, including cleaning duties & working bees.

Enrolment

If you would like to apply for enrolment, please submit an Application for Enrolment form for each child at the Covenant Office with the enrolment fee (\$75 for one student or \$150 for two or more students). This is a non-refundable administration fee.

Subject to an interview and a letter of offer, places are granted to students in Kindergarten to Year 10. A number of criteria are taken into consideration before an interview takes place and a position is offered. Preference is typically given to Protestant Christian families who maintain regular church attendance; however, enrolments are also available for families not meeting this criteria.

One full term's notice of withdrawal must be given in writing or a term's fees are payable in lieu of notice.

We seek to guide students to:

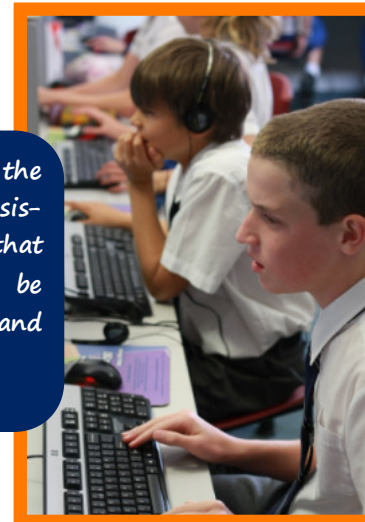
- See creation as the handiwork of God, and treat it with respect in the ways we seek to use and preserve it.

Primary Years K-6

Secondary Years 7-10

The Secondary curriculum centres around several core subjects which provides general education at first, building on the foundation laid in the Primary years.

Students trial electives by term or semester in Years 7-8, with options broadened as students move into Years 9-10.
